Essential Lessons for Family Protection: Master the 113 Hotline and Alcohol Addiction Subsidies to Reject the Incursion of Alcohol and Violence

On March 19, 2026, the Shilin District Prosecutors Office held a legal education session, inviting Director Wang Li-jie and Attorney Fu Hsin-yi to lecture for probationers. Prior to the classes, short anti-fraud films from the "Think Calmly" series, titled "Don't Risk Being a Money Mule; It's a Tough Road Ahead," were screened. The session reminded attendees not to serve as "money mules" for fraud syndicates out of a sense of fluke, as doing so could ruin their futures and lead to severe legal consequences. It was further emphasized that violations of the Fraud Crime Hazard Prevention Act can carry a maximum sentence of 12 years in prison.

The first session, "Alcohol, Health, and Drunk Driving Prevention," was conducted by Director Wang Li-chieh. Director Wang pointed out that approximately 47% of Taiwan's population lacks the ALDH2 enzyme, making their alcohol metabolism the poorest in the world; those who experience facial flushing while drinking face a risk of cancer up to 50 times higher. Alcohol is classified by the WHO as a Group 1 carcinogen, causing cirrhosis, cardiovascular diseases, and irreversible Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders. Every year in Taiwan, nearly 10,000 people are injured or killed due to drunk driving, resulting in a social loss of NT\$18.4 billion. Emphasizing that "there is no safe amount of alcohol consumption," Director Wang urged participants to use the CAGE questionnaire for self-screening and to utilize the Ministry of Health and Welfare's alcohol addiction treatment subsidy (up to NT\$40,000 per person per year) and the consultation hotline (0800-255959) to prevent the destruction of lives and families at the source.

The second session, "Discussing the Domestic Violence Prevention Act," was led by Attorney Fu Hsin-yi. Attorney Fu emphasized that domestic violence is not merely a private family

matter but a social order issue involving physical, mental, economic, and digital violence. She noted that reported cases in Taiwan are rising annually. The Domestic Violence Prevention Act has been updated to explicitly protect against the distribution of sexual images and to cover children who witness domestic violence. The law provides three types of protection orders—emergency, temporary, and ordinary—to immediately stop harm; violating these orders can lead to up to 3 years in prison. Furthermore, with technological advancements, digital monitoring and AI risk early-warning systems have become new trends in prevention. Participants were encouraged to use the 113 Protection Hotline and legal aid resources to protect their rights through legal evidence collection.

Following the sessions, the Prosecutors Office addressed the current fraud climate and the upcoming "Nine-in-One Local Elections" at the end of the year. Attendees were urged to remain highly vigilant: call 165 for fraud concerns, and report bribery via the hotline 0800-024-099 (press 4 after connecting).
